## State of South Caroling Sovernor's Proclamation

- WHEREAS, sudden unexplained death in childhood (SUDC) is a category of death in children between the ages of 1 and 18 that remains unexplained after a thorough investigation, including an autopsy; and
- WHEREAS, each year, SUDC claims the lives of approximately 400 children in the United States, including more than 200 younger children between the ages of 1 and 4 who die without any clear cause or explanation; and
- WHEREAS, while less common than sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS), which occurs before the first birthday, SUDC is an important health concern and the 5<sup>th</sup> leading category of death among children ages 1 to 4 in the United States; and
- WHEREAS, currently there is no wat to predict or prevent SUDC as its cause is unknown, but research continues in the search for risk factors and preventative measures.
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, Henry McMaster, Governor of the great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim March 2023 as
