Whereas, Sudden Unexplained Death in Childhood (SUDC) is a category of death in children between the ages of one and 18 that remains unexplained after a thorough investigation, including an autopsy; and,

Whereas, each year there are approximately 400 cases of SUDC in the United States - including more than 200 younger children between the ages of one and four - who die without any clear cause or explanation; and,

Whereas, while less common than sudden infant death syndrome (SIDS), which occurs before the first birthday, SUDC is an important health concern deserving of increased public awareness and research; and,

Whereas, SUDC is the fifth leading category of death among children ages one to four in the United States; and,

Whereas, there currently is no way to predict or prevent SUDC, as its cause is unknown; and,

Whereas, it is hoped that future research will identify means by which SUDC can be prevented:
